Doubt - A Great Obstacle (Part 1 of 2)

Life beyond this world - no aging, tears, pain, death, etc., - fact or fiction? I wanted these things to be true; I thrilled at the prospect of eternal life with God and my family; but is it true? It seemed possible, surely there's a greater purpose to life, but the experts say "No!", and they say they can prove it (but they can't!). I'm no expert, but I know that hoping a thing to be true doesn't make it true! We may also wonder, "Can so many "experts" be wrong?" Does God exist? Are the historical records regarding Jesus' life, death and resurrection true? Is the Bible really the inspired, inerrant word of the living God? Could I know, or was I condemned to a life of uncertainty? Another doubt also steals confidence; i.e. even if these things are true, can I go to heaven? I can see why the Creator loves some people, but not me! I preferred heaven, but it seemed to be just out of my reach. I needed help, but help can be hard to find! If only I could know and be sure!

Others seemed so sure, the way I *wanted* to feel! I assumed they had good reasons for their confidence, so I asked for their help. Either they wouldn't, or more likely *couldn't*, give me *reasons* for their confidence. I wondered, "Why could some people believe the Bible is inspired of God without verification, but I couldn't?" Occasionally I felt worse after mentioning my doubts to some of my brethren; according to them, I had a heart problem; i.e. the inability to trust God. The problem was I *knew* I could *trust* God and the Bible *if I had just had sufficient evidence*, but I was led to believe that no such evidence exists; I must learn to trust even without a cause! I wanted to, I tried to, but I couldn't make those nagging doubts go away. If you've never had doubts you might not understand, but they hold a person back and keep them from giving their whole being to the Lord. One thing I'm certain of; every person tormented by doubt wants to destroy it!

A lot of time has now gone by; I never stopped searching for answers. Why? I've asked myself the same question and came up with two reasons: (1) I doubted my doubts! Maybe there was hope for me yet! (2) I thought I could help my wife, children and others, so I continued on. *Continued...*

I don't enjoy exposing my weaknesses, and especially to people I may never see or know, but I suppose my own experience might help someone else deal with their doubts and fears. If so, a little embarrassment today is a small price to pay if it helps someone overcome their doubts and go on to salvation. Let me explain what I learned from my experience.

First, there *are* good reasons to believe in God, the Bible and Jesus! As a matter of fact, the faith that pleases our Creator is one that is built on reason or evidence (Psa.19; Rom.1:17; Heb.11:1). You may not know those reasons right now, but I can assure you that you are capable of understanding them once they're made known to you. Don't give up!

Second, don't be intimidated by others! I learned that some believers won't give you good reasons for their faith because they don't have any reasons to give. Some people have inherited faith from others, or believe because they want these things to be true. This might explain the indifference and disobedience often seen in the lives of believers. One isn't likely to turn their life over to Christ unless they first know that their sacrifice is not in vain. Don't become discouraged; we grow in faith, and proofs or evidences must be acquired before faith can reach maturity.

Third, don't be afraid to seek help! If one can't help, move to another. One of my greatest challenges was finding the *right person* to help

me. Don't be misled; there are many people who *can* give you a storehouse of solid reasons for their faith. When you find them, squeeze them like a grape, and soak up all the knowledge you can! Sadly, all churches aren't equal; i.e. some merely exist, whereas others are alive and growing in Christ. Unable to get the instruction they desperately desired, some have placed membership with another congregation, one seeking to go on to perfection. Eternity hangs in the balance; we can maintain the status quo, or we can go all the way with the Lord. Choose wisely.

Fourth, be patient! We must work out our own salvation with fear and trembling (Phil.2:12). A strong faith must be built and time is required to do it. The Son of God has promised to assist us on our heavenward journey, but we must also be willing to help ourselves. Time and effort are required to build faith, but what better way could you spend your time in the body? If I read the Bible correctly, this is the reason for our being here, is it not? (cf. Ecc.12:13-14)

Fifth, *help others*! You're not the first to struggle with doubt, you won't be the last. As you acquire faith-producing evidence, make sure you let others know your reasons (cf. 1 Pet.3:15). Like you and I, most people want to build a rock-solid faith so they can *know* that their sacrifice to Christ is not in vain.

To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints."
